



5 of the most used verbs in English and how to conjugate them

Verbs in any language are the basic building blocks of a sentence and in English there are lots of verbs! So let's take a look at five of the most common verbs and how to conjugate them to different verb tenses!

Ask - Perguntar (regular)	
Present simple	ask (I / you / we / they ask) asks (he / she / it asks)
Past simple	asked (I asked, you asked, he/she/it asked, we asked, they asked)
Present perfect simple	have asked (I / you / we / they have asked) has asked (he / she / it has asked)

Look - Olhar (regular)	
Present simple	look (I / you / we / they look) looks (he / she / it looks)
Past simple	looked (I looked, you looked, he/she/it looked, we looked, they looked)
Present perfect simple	have looked (I / you / we / they have looked) has looked (he / she / it has looked)

Call - Ligar (regular)		
Present simple	call (I / you / we / they call) calls (he / she / it calls)	
Past simple	called (I called, you called, he/she/it called, we called, they called)	
Present perfect simple	have called (I / you / we / they have called) has called (he / she / it has called)	



Come - Vir (irregular)	
Present simple	come (I / you / we / they come) comes (he / she / it comes)
Past simple	came (I came, you came, he/she/it came, we came, they came)
Present perfect simple	have come (I / you / we / they have come) has come (he/she/it has come)

Do - Fazer (irregular)	
Present simple	do (I / you / we / they do) does (he/she/it does)
Past simple	did (I did, you did, he/she/it did, we did, they did)
Present perfect simple	have done (I / you / we/ they have done) has done (he/she/it has done)

Example:

Ask (Regular)	I <i>ask</i> my dad for help. Yesterday I <i>asked</i> my mom what her favorite color is. I <i>have asked</i> my teacher many questions.
Look Regular)	I always <i>look</i> for the sales. Last night, they <i>look</i> ed at the website. We <i>have looked</i> for more information about our trip to Mexico.
Call (Regular)	I <i>call</i> my best friend for advice if I feel sad. Last week, you <i>called</i> my sister to see how she was. I <i>have</i> always <i>called</i> my grandmother "Nana".
Come (Irregular)	He <i>comes</i> to school on time every day. Last Saturday, we <i>came</i> home after the cinema. I <i>have</i> never <i>come</i> late to piano lessons.
Do (Irregular)	She <i>does</i> her homework on Mondays. Yesterday I <i>did</i> all my chores. You <i>have done</i> well in school this year.
